WHAT IS PLACED-BASED LEARNING & CIVIC ENTREPRENEURSHIP?

It is a teaching and learning process that uses local environment and community as the context for learning. Place-Based Learning focuses on utilizing local resources as teaching tools. Students are involved in problem-solving and other meaningful tasks; they work autonomously to construct their own learning which culminates in realistic, student-generated products. The place of learning is the local community and environment. Students are engaged in learning that is connected to real work that meets a real community need and the work is student driven. There are three goals to the **Northwest Mississippi Endowment for Place-Based Education** & Civic Entrepreneurship:

- Goal 1 Engaging K-12 Students in Real-World Geographic Issues by following the standards in "Geography for Life", and engaging them in real-life problems related to environments, economics and cultures. Teachers and students will engage in the study of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and other appropriate technologies such as videography and sound recording.
- □ **Goal 2** *Supporting Innovation in Professional Development of K-12 Geography Educators* again using the stands of "Geography for Life" and helping students learn about how the world works.
- □ **Goal 3** *Establishing Geography's Position and Importance in the K-12 Curriculum* working through partnerships with state geographic alliances, business roundtables, governmental agencies and caucuses, as well as associations of nonprofit organizations.

Placed-Based Education is designed to improve students, educators, local citizens and policy makers to be lifelong learners and agents of positive change, with local places – as well as the larger world – as their classroom. Young people will be encouraged to think about issues of vocation and service, to encourage them to consider how they can best use their intellectual gifts and heritage to pursue careers in ways that will serve and enrich their communities.
