



About the Get2College Delta Mini-Grant

What is a Get2College mini-grant?

There are many barriers to college for students who are low-income, first generation, or students of color. Get2College grants provide schools and nonprofit organizations the opportunity to pay for special projects to help put college within reach for students in Mississippi. Get2College Delta mini-grants are available in the following 18 counties: Bolivar, Carroll, Coahoma, Desoto, Holmes, Humphreys, Issaquena, Leflore, Panola, Quitman, Sharkey, Sunflower, Tallahatchie, Tate, Tunica, Warren, Washington, and Yazoo. The ultimate goal is to support local organizations that help students realize the dream of a college education.

Award process

- Get2college Delta mini-grants will be available beginning January 1, 2020, and accepted on a rolling basis until allocated funding is depleted. The awards will be made on first-come, first-served basis.
- One grant application per eligible organization allowed.
- Grants range from \$250 to \$1250.
- The Community Foundation of Northwest Mississippi will contact all applicants within 30 days after your application has been received.

Award examples

Possible grants may include, but are not limited to:

- Professional development for counselors/teachers (Southern Association for College Admission Counseling - SACAC conference or college tour, National College Access Network - NCAN conference)
- Measuring program success with National Student Clearinghouse data
- College tours
- College fairs
- ACT prep
- Technology to support online workshops for students and counselor training
- Support for MS College Countdown activities (application, FAFSA, and signing days)

Projects we won't fund

- Scholarships
- Endowments
- College application fees
- Tuition

Reporting

All grant recipients will be required to submit a brief evaluation report within 30 days following the conclusion of your project. This report can be found on the Community Foundation of Northwest Mississippi website at **www.CFNM.org**. Non-compliance could exclude an organization from future grant opportunity eligibility.
